- ensuring that consideration of the modern slavery risks and prevention are added to Qa's policy review process.
- making sure procurement strategies and contract terms and conditions include references to modern slavery and human trafficking.
- continuing to take action to embed a zero-tolerance policy towards modern slavery.
- ensuring that staff involved in employee recruitment receive training on modern slavery and ethical employment practices.
